EDUCATION

Renaissance humanist Lorenzo Valla dedicated his life to studying classical texts. He believed that Classical Latin was the purest, most beautiful form of Latin. That is, until he stumbled across a document by the name of the <u>Donation of</u> <u>Constantine</u>, in which the Roman emperor Constantine I supposedly bestowed vast amounts of land to the Pope. However, Valla noticed that the form of Latin used in the text did not match the Late Latin used in Constatine's time, thus questioning its authenticity.
